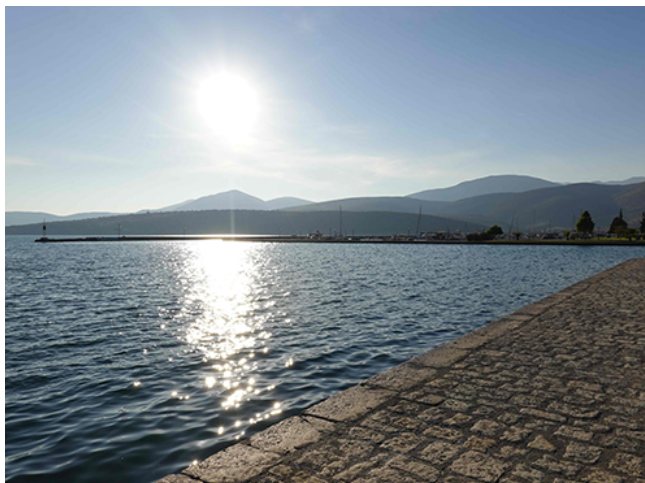


Meet in Athens APR 20 - part ways morning of MAY 01

Continue through the dramatic mountain roads to Byzantine Mystras and the tranquil seaside village of Kyllini. Then it's on to Delphi and a three-night stay at a stunning winery estate in Achinos. From here, visit Meteora's cliff-top monasteries, soak in natural hot springs, and savor the slow pace of rural Greece.

Wrap up your journey with a final night of pampering back in Athens.
